During the spring rainy season, potholes can develop within hours. When the top layer (asphalt pavement) of the roadway is worn away, potholes occur. Water on the surface seeps into cracks and then into the gravel roadbed and soil. The pumping movement of vehicle tires removes soil and forms cavities. The pavement collapses into the cavity causing a

pothole.

Driving over potholes may result in property damage to vehicles or bodily injury to the public. The most extensive types of damage to automobiles are alignment problems, damage to undercarriage, mufflers, shocks, axles, tires, and rims. Some motorist may react to potholes by swerving and causing a motor vehicle

accident. Deep potholes can even trigger airbags and cause deployment, which could injure the face, chest, hands, and arms of drivers and passengers. Many minor potholes incidents are never reported to city governments.

The fact that a pothole develops does not mean that your City

has been negligent or has failed in its responsibilities. In most cases, the City is NOT LIABLE for any damage where the City has not received actual or constructive notice of the problem and the City has not had the opportunity to repair the hole or warn of the danger. Liability may occur when the City fails to take sufficient corrective action within a reasonable time.

The following information should be gathered to help in the liability investigation:

- Exact Location?
- Dimensions? (Length, Width, and Depth)
- What Claimant Reported?
- When Reported?
- Witnesses? Provide Statements.
- Photos?
- Prior Notification?
